The piano introduction is in 3/4 time, key of D major. It begins with a forte (f) dynamic and features a series of chords in the right hand and a simple bass line in the left hand. The piece concludes with a fortissimo (ff) dynamic.

The vocal entry begins with the lyrics: "1. See, moth - er dear, 2. List - en, my child,". The piano accompaniment is marked *rall. e dim* (rallentando e diminuendo). The melody is simple and sentimental, with the piano providing harmonic support.
